



## PATIENT HISTORY

An 82-year-old woman sustained a dog bite on her left shin. The skin was avulsed and a foul, draining, necrotic wound developed. After 14 weeks without improvement with standard of care, she presented for wound care. The patient's medical history was significant for hyperlipidemia, previous smoking, and dementia. At the time of

initial presentation to the wound clinic, (6/7/14) the leg was swollen, erythematous, and tender. Culture results were positive for *A. baumannii* and *S. maltophilia*. The wound was cleansed and irrigated once daily with Puracyn<sup>®</sup> Plus Professional Formula Wound Irrigation Solution. Devitalized material and debris were removed with sharp debridement.

The wound was dressed with sterile gauze moistened with Puracyn Plus. A bulky, protective bandage was constructed. This protocol was followed for four consecutive days, after which she was seen twice a week for the above-mentioned protocol. She was discharged on 8/19/14.
